Guests can tour these waterways by a popular water taxi service which runs every 30 minutes from convenient stops throughout the city or on board specialty chartered vessels.

- Performing Arts -

With its waterfront festivals, parades and boat shows, Fort Lauderdale exudes a fun-loving, beach-town atmosphere, but it also offers year round cultural events. The Broward Center for the Performing Arts regularly hosts operas, ballets, theater productions, symphony concerts and other performances by both local and touring companies. Smaller cinemas and theaters such as Cinema Paradiso and Parker Playhouse are also favorite venues for film festivals and original performances.

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The Fort Lauderdale Museum of Art houses a vast collection of permanent and rotating exhibits featuring national and international artists. The Museum of Discovery and Science is a great place for hands-on learning; perfect for kids and the young-at-heart. It houses more than 200 interactive exhibits on Aviation, Florida wildlife, Aquarium Exhibit and an IMAX Theatre.

- Shopping and Dining -

Dining and shopping continue to be regarded as preferred activities for affluent travelers. Fort Lauderdale does not disappoint. Its famous Las Olas Boulevard offers a charming collection of outdoor eateries, boutiques, art galleries and live music venues. The Galleria Mall, anchored by Neiman Marcus, is a fashionista's playground for the latest runway looks while Dania Beach's Antique Row, located five miles south, is a haven for past treasures.

The area's restaurants range from formal to eclectic. The Atlantic Hotel's Trina restaurant continues to receive accolades as one of the area's best. Nearby, Galanga Thai Kitchen and Sushi is known for its stylish ambiance, stellar people watching, authentic Thai cuisine and top-quality sushi. A favorite casual eatery is Southport Raw Bar, serving oysters, fresh seafood and the best key lime pie in town.

- Nightlife -

Fort Lauderdale has nightlife options to suit every taste and mood. The Atlantic Hotel's own bar at Trina and its fifth floor Ocean Terrace both offer panoramic ocean views. Newly opened O Lounge – adjacent to Yolo restaurant – and Living Room dance club attract a diverse mix of well-heeled clientele. Blue Martini in The Galleria Mall features live music nightly.

- Outdoor Recreation -

Fort Lauderdale offers visitors plenty of time in the sun with a wide array of outdoor activities including seaside boat tours, deep-sea fishing, wreck- and reef-diving, parasailing and snorkeling. The area is also home to dozens of golf courses and excellent tennis facilities and is very bike-friendly, with bike lanes that run throughout the city and up and down the beachfront.

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Bonnet House Museum and Gardens, a circa 1921 Caribbean plantation-style waterfront home, is a local treasure. The historic estate, set in a lush beachside setting features a distinctive art collection, orchid exhibit, and array of ecosystems that support a variety of wildlife including elusive spider monkeys. Hugh Taylor Birch State Park, on Fort Lauderdale Beach, offers four distinct natural communities and more than 200 species of birds.

- Sports -

Fort Lauderdale is a rewarding destination for sporting enthusiasts. In addition to fishing tournaments and boat races, the area has its share of professional organizations. The Bank Atlantic Center hosts the Florida Panthers hockey team as well as other sporting events and concerts. Also nearby is Dolphin Stadium, home to the Florida Marlins baseball team, Miami Dolphins football team and the upcoming Super Bowl XLIV 2010.

- Location, Location, Location -

The Atlantic Hotel is conveniently located between the palm-shaded boulevards of Sunrise and Las Olas. It is five miles from Fort Lauderdale/ Hollywood International Airport and 27 miles from Miami International Airport. The property is also four miles to Port Everglades Cruise Terminals making it an ideal pre- or post-cruise retreat.
